

Dear Parents/Guardians

Contributions for 2020

The Belmont Primary School Council has endorsed a schedule of Contributions and Charges for 2020. The schedule is broken into four sections to help you calculate costs that you might incur throughout the school year.

The total amount of **contributions** parents and carers are being asked to pay has been contained within the \$60 maximum set in the School Education Regulations 2000.

2020 Contributions are as follows (each child)

While **contributions** are voluntary, the quality of our teaching and learning program will be maximised when each family makes its contribution to the cost of supplementing funding we get from other sources, including the State and Commonwealth governments.

Money collected will be used to supplement school expenditure in the areas listed below.

Charges for Extra Curricula Cost Components.

A breakdown of **charges** for your child's participation in incursions, excursions activities etc. for 2020 are set out in the schedule below. Students <u>will only incur costs when they are involved in a particular activity</u>. The amounts indicated on the schedule below represent the **maximum** charged for scheduled activities in 2020. As in the past you will be asked to make payment for each activity as it approaches.

If your child is involved in some, many, or all of the activities mentioned below, you need to be aware the following costs will apply. All charges are presented as 'per student':

Items for Personal Use - (Previously called "Booklist")

The charge for Personal Use Items will vary from student to student and includes:

Pupil requirements (required for all lessons) stationery items, calculator etc.

Pupil requirements (recommended but not essential for all lessons) eg: tissues, art shirt, library bag etc

All students will be given a list of personal use items which they require on a day-to-day basis. Suggested suppliers are clearly indicated on the form. Experience has shown that 'cheaper' items available through some suppliers are of inferior quality and do not 'last the distance'. We have found that 'quality' brands are more serviceable and save parents / carers money in the long term. Please consider this when making purchases.

Your child will need to have the listed materials each school day, so it may be necessary to replace some items, such as pencils, throughout the year.

Other Costs - Optional

- Whole School Activities to raise funds for special projects eg: Dress Up Days
- Ongoing fundraising for specific projects run by our P & C / School eg Spellathon
- School Photos (Class and individual) are taken in Term 2
- Book Club is organised by a volunteer and children have the opportunity to order twice per term.
