# Kindergarten 2021



Kindergarten enrolments are now open for 2021!

Western Australia now has immunisation laws that will Kindergarten help to better protect our children and the wider

community vaccine-preventable from diseases.

When you enrol your child Kindergarten you will need to provide child's Australian current Immunisation Register (AIR)Immunisation History Statement, which shows your child is 'up-to-date' with all the scheduled immunisations (according to the National Immunisation Program) for their age. This Statement must be no more than two months old.

In most cases, your child will be offered a place at your local public school or a Community Kindergarten linked to your local school. However, if the number of Kindergarten applications exceeds number of places available, you may be referred to a nearby Kindergarten which has places available. Every effort is made to accommodate your child in a school as close as possible to your home.

If your child is four years old by 30 June 2021 you can apply to enrol them in Kindergarten for 2021.

X Any drinks other than plain water including fruit or vegetable juice, fruit juice drink, fruit cordial, mineral waters, carbonated water All other foods not permitted include: X Dips, including those that are vegetable based ✓ All fresh vegetables (eg celery, carrot sticks, broccoli bits etc.) X 'Fruit' products (eg fruit leather, fruit roll-ups, fruit bars or similar) X Fruit jams, jellies, pies and cakes ✓ All fresh fruit (eg whole fruits, chopped melon etc.) X Fruit canned in syrup or jelly or with artificial sweeteners ✓ Fruit canned in water, juice or 'no added sugar' (eg peach slices) **X** Canned or processed vegetables X Vegetable or potato crisps, hot potato chips ✓ Dried fruit - please limit as it contains concentrated sugar and tends to cling to teeth, increasing risk of tooth decay ✗ Vegetable pastries (pies, pasties, sausage rolls) ✗ Vegetable cakes, fritters, quiches, breads or similar ✓ Only plain water **X** Popcorn

### SCHOOL DRESS CODE



#### **RATIONALE**

The School Community believes a school dress code:

- Promotes and enhances the public image of the school
- ◆ Fosters in students the sense of belonging and of loyalty and pride in their school
- ♦ Encourages equity amongst students
- Assists staff in ensuring the safety of all students
- ♦ Enables recognition of students when on out-of-school excursions
- Helps establish a positive working tone within the school which assists in building school and team spirit.
- ♦ Keeps clothing costs to a minimum

#### ALL STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO WEAR UNIFORMS

This means that any students accepting enrolment in this school are expected to wear our uniform unless there are special circumstances which have been negotiated with the Principal at the time of enrolment.

"Acceptance of enrolment at a school assumes an agreement between the school, the parent/guardian and the enrolling student that the student will dress within the guidelines of the school dress code. If the dress code is unacceptable, parents have the right to apply for admission to a school where the dress code reflects their preference."

Department of Education Policy.

#### **EXEMPTIONS**

- Exemptions or modifications for:
- Religious reasons, or
- Medical reasons,
- May be negotiated with the Principal at the time of enrolment.

#### STUDENTS NOT FOLLOWING THE DRESS CODE:

- 1. Note and Phone call home to parents
- 2. Parent interview for repeated non-compliance
- 3. May be excluded from excursions, school representation
- 4. May be expected to wear a uniform supplied by the school for the day.

#### SCHOOL DRESS REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A policy of "no hat, no play" applies at all times
- 2. Closed in shoes to be worn for safety reasons, and at all times for Physical Education and Sport. Appropriate secure sandals may be worn for all other activities. Open shoes such as slip-on sandals, crocs and thongs are not acceptable safe footwear for school.
- 3. Students must not wear any additional items for clothing which are not part of the school uniform eg bicycle pants, leggings, check shirts, denim.
- 4. No jewellery other than studs/sleepers in ears and a watch may be worn
- 5. No make-up including nail polish and spray on hair colour
- 6. For health and safety reasons, all long hair (boys and girls) must be tied back
- 7. Students to remove over-jackets worn for extra warmth during the colder months when inside the classroom.

#### THE UNIFORM:

The uniform is as follows

- ♦ Royal Blue school Polo with school crest.
- ♦ Royal Blue school windcheater/jacket with school crest.
- ♦ Royal Blue shorts/blue skorts.
- ♦ Royal Blue tracksuit pants or Royal Blue Cargo pants..
